HAVE YOU BEEN IN CONTACT WITH YOUR ADVISOR?

If you have not been in contact with your advisor, it is recommended you do so in order to receive guidance for your course registration plan for the semester. It is possible your advisor may handle registering you for courses on your behalf. You may discuss options available with your advisor directly.

HAVE YOU COMPLETED AND RETURNED THE COURSE REQUEST FORM?

HAVE YOU ACTIVATED YOUR SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY NetID?

Access to the University's network is controlled by a unique personal identifier – the NetID. To log in to the Syracuse University system, you will need to activate your NetID by visiting the Information Technology and Services website.

You will need your **SUID** number provided to you in the admission letter you received from Syracuse University. Once activated, you can log into **myslice.syr.edu**, which gives you access to:

- Your Syracuse University email account (SUMail)
- Online class registration (Enroll in a Class link)
- Syracuse University Bursar Billing account
- Grades
- Blackboard, a platform that some professors use to communicate assignments

CLASS REGISTRATION - IMPORTANT DATES

New exchange or visiting students will be able to use the MySlice online class registration - Enroll in a Class link. For the fall semester, the link will be available about the middle of August and for the spring semester about the beginning of January. Please check your MySlice account to see when you may start using self-service prior to your arrival.

You may also register for courses after you have completed the International Student Orientation after your arrival to Syracuse University. You will have the opportunity to adjust your course schedule during the "add/drop" period that takes place during the first week of the semester. Any questions should be directed to your advisor.

FULL TIME STUDENT STATUS

During your semester at Syracuse University, you are expected to enroll as a full-time student. Full-time status is a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester (4 courses) for undergraduates and 9 credit hours (3 courses) for graduate students. You are allowed to enroll in 18 credits (6 courses) during each semester, but most undergraduate students take 12-15 credits. You will register for courses, take exams, and receive a transcript of your grades just as all regular students do. You also receive the same privileges and benefits as a regular student.
