

SUSTAINABILITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE IN EUROPE January 5-16, 20

GEO 300.1: A Signature Seminar in Europe (3 credits)

January 5-16, 2017 Copenhagen, Bergen, Stockholm, Inari

THE PROGRAM

Sustainability and Environmental Justice in Europe is a Signature Seminar designed for students before they arrive for their semester abroad at SU London.

Students travel as a group to discover how innovation is keeping the Nordic countries of Denmark, Norway, Sweden, and Finland ranked as the most sustainable places on the planet. The concepts and practices of sustainability and critical geographies are introduced to enable students to see how progress towards sustainable development goals made here compares to other parts of the region and the world.

The academic field of environmental justice is also examined so that students can assess whether this progress is still enough to ensure all life can flourish. Students will see how global environmental crises have a more negative impact on the Nordic countries than elsewhere in Europe. In each of the destinations,

students will have a direct experience of the inequalities in access to clean air, water, energy and land.

APPLICATION

To apply, log into the SU Abroad application system and indicate that you are interested by **Friday, October 28**. If accepted, you must pay a \$300 non-refundable deposit to the Bursar's office within a week of your acceptance.

ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION

All students accepted for the Spring 2017 semester in London can apply for this seminar. Space is limited to 18 people.

CANCELLATION

If there is insufficient interest, the seminar will be cancelled and your deposit will be applied to your semester charges.

WITHDRAWAL

The deadline to withdraw from the Seminar or the London program is **November 7, 2016**. After this date, the \$300 deposit is non-refundable and students



are responsible for any unrecoverable costs associated with the program (i.e., hotel, transportation costs)

COSTS

The seminar program fee of \$2,375 includes travel between Denmark. Sweden, Norway, Finland, and London: all travel, entrance fees to sites, materials. accommodations with breakfast each day, at least three dinners, and some lunches.
