Prepare for Online Registration (May 30–June 5)

STEP 1: Request courses

- Review this packet and [course descriptions](#) on the Syracuse Abroad website.
- Select courses and plan your desired schedule, consulting the [Time Schedule of Classes](#). Meeting days and times for some courses are not yet available (noted as TBA on the schedule). As soon as this information is available, our office will update you via email.
 - You need special permission from Syracuse Abroad to take any course other than those found on the Time Schedule. (Exceptions are made for pre-approved [IE University courses](#) for students accepted to that program.)
- Follow the online instructions to complete the Student Advising Form (SAF):
 - Log into your [OrangeAbroad](#) account. Go to **Learning Content: Post-decision > Academic Packet**.
- Submit your SAF by **April 16**. Be sure to hit “Submit.” (Don’t simply print your SAF!)
 - **Do NOT submit more than one questionnaire.**

STEP 2: See your advisor and upload your signed SAF to OrangeAbroad

- Print the PDF of your submitted SAF (emailed to you after submission), and take it to your advisor(s) for signature(s) and to ensure your course plan will keep you on track for graduation.
 - It is helpful to print and provide your advisor with [descriptions](#) of all the courses you want to have approved.
- Upload SAF signed by your advisor(s) to OrangeAbroad by **April 30**.
 - Upload to Questionnaires: Student Advising Form (*with Advisor’s Signature*). Be sure to hit “Submit” (NOT “Save”!). **Only legible PDF files will be accepted.**
 - Syracuse Abroad will record any changes made on your uploaded Student Advising Form as a result of your meeting with your advisor(s). Please indicate whether you have made any changes to your original selections.
- You may return to OrangeAbroad to access your uploaded form. It can be helpful to refer to your SAF when you register online May 30–June 5.



Grades and Academic Resources

- At Syracuse University, all work for registered classes must be completed on or before the degree certification date. If you are graduating, seek advice from your home college regarding your degree certification date, and also be certain that you are aware of any remaining degree requirements.
- Information on enrollment policies, grades, SU library resources, registration, internships and independent research can be found on the [Preparing To Go website](#). **Visiting students** should also look at this website for information on transfer credit and [requesting an SU transcript](#).
- Carefully review [academic policies](#) applicable to all Syracuse Abroad programs.
- If you need to take an [online course](#) during a semester abroad, first review Syracuse Abroad-specific policy.
- Arrangements to do coursework on an [independent research basis](#), if needed to satisfy a degree requirement, must be made **in advance**. Due date for proposals is **May 15**.
- Check your @syr.edu email address regularly for messages from Syracuse Abroad.



Course Information

All the courses expected to be offered this semester are listed on the provisional [Time Schedule of Classes](#) and [Timetable schematic](#). Syracuse University reserves the right to cancel a course with low enrollment or to change the course format to an independent study.

- Where there is greater demand than space available in a course, preference for enrollment is given to majors and minors or others who can demonstrate academic need (*i.e.*, the course fulfills a specific requirement that cannot be met by another course) and who have listed the course among their Primary Course Selections on the SAF.
- Be sure you have met all prerequisites for courses you plan to take. Prerequisites are indicated in [course descriptions](#), with equivalent courses described for visiting students. If you do not meet the prerequisite, do not include the course on your SAF.

Program Requirements

All students are required to take the following:

- A **Signature Seminar** ([Azahar](#), [Imperium](#), [Spanish Identities](#), or [Marine Ecology of the Mediterranean Sea and North Africa](#); 3 credits). You may not drop the Signature Seminar.
- A **minimum of 12 credits** *in addition to* Signature Seminar credits. Due to the Spanish immigration requirements that undergraduate students enroll on a full-time basis, you may not drop below 12 credits (excluding any Signature Seminar credits) at any point during the semester.

- **At least one course taught in Spanish. Students at an advanced level must take TWO courses.** You can find out your specific requirement(s) by identifying your language level and consulting the following chart. Please also refer to the [course descriptions](#) on our website.

Spanish Language Placement Exam

Visiting students: If you are unsure of your language level, review the Spanish language [course descriptions](#) and consult with an advisor in the languages department of your home school. You may also request access to SU’s online placement exam by [emailing Jeanne Chu](#).

MATRICULATED SYRACUSE STUDENTS: Unless one of the below applies, you must take the online Spanish language placement exam (accessed through [MySlice](#)) **BEFORE** submitting your SAF!

- You have already taken one or more SPA classes at Syracuse, OR
- You have previously taken SU’s Spanish online placement exam.

All other SU students—including beginners, native and heritage speakers of Spanish, AND students with AP, IB, or other college-level or transfer Spanish credit—must take the placement exam. This will identify your language level and allow you to register for the appropriate course. [Instructions on accessing this exam](#) are available online.

SU Spanish beginners: YES! Even if you have no experience studying the language, you must complete the exam in order to receive your SPA 101 placement. *If you don’t take the exam, MySlice will prevent you from registering online for your Spanish class.* No exceptions.

ALL STUDENTS, please note! The exam was written for first-year college students. When you are asked how many years you have studied Spanish in high school, respond with your **TOTAL NUMBER of years** of Spanish study, **whether in high school or college.**

Study Tours and Course Fees

Some courses include required study tours, site visits, or activities that are an integral part of the course. Please carefully review the [Course-related Fee Sheet](#), and also share it with your parents/guardians if they are responsible for your fees. Fees to cover the costs of supplies and mandatory field study are charged automatically to your Bursar account when you register.

If you register for any course with a mandatory study tour, you must participate in this field study. **DO NOT PLAN PERSONAL TRAVEL until you get to Madrid and know when you may be required to take part in a class-related study tour, make-up classes, Signature Seminar sessions, exam periods, and other academic commitments.**

Online Registration

You will register online **May 30-June 5**. In **mid-May**, before online registration starts, you will receive information about registering for your Madrid Center courses. Be sure to regularly check your email for this information. The Registration Packet will include instructions, FAQs, and your individual registration appointment time.

During online registration, you must register for 12-16 credits (up to 5 semester courses), not counting Signature Seminar credits. Students participating in a [Special Program](#) must register online for their Syracuse Madrid Center courses through SU's [MySlice](#) system; you will register for your local university courses separately.

Remember that some courses are likely to reach capacity and close during registration. Be sure to select some alternative classes on your Student Advising Form, in case a class you would like to take is closed when you register.

→ Any registration restrictions will be announced in the Registration Packet available prior to online registration.

Special Program: Madrid Center & Business at IE University

This section applies *only* to students who have applied and been accepted to the [Madrid Center & Business at IE University special program](#).

Please note that IE University (IEU) follows a different academic calendar from US-based institutions. If you participate in this program, you will *not* be able to participate in the pre-semester Signature Seminar in Fall 2018, and you will be required to stay beyond the regular SU Madrid Center program end-date. The program is expected to end on **December 21**. Confirmation of the program end-date is expected in May.

Grades for courses taken at IEU may not be posted to your SU transcript until February. At Syracuse University, all work for registered classes must be completed on or before the degree certification date. Again, if you are graduating, seek advice from your home college regarding your degree certification date.

Registration at IEU is limited to 1–2 courses, so students in this program will also take two or more course(s) at the Madrid Center. Please pre-select Madrid Center courses of interest to you on your SAF and obtain advising and approval for these courses.

You will enroll in IEU classes IEU's online platform **in July**, separately from Syracuse's online registration process in MySlice.

Please note: Not all of the IEU courses listed on our [website](#) will necessarily be available this fall. IEU does not confirm its offerings until its online registration cycle.

→ We cannot guarantee specific course offerings. Therefore, you should not count on taking—or fulfilling specific degree requirements with—a particular IEU course. Instead, select several alternative courses and have them approved by your home college.

IEU courses are open only to students accepted to the program. Courses offered in past fall semesters include:

Course-related Fees Madrid - Fall 2018

Review and give to your parent/guardian.

Students who register for any of the courses listed below will be charged a fee to cover special activities, such as study tours or site visits, which are an integral part of each course. Study tour fees may reflect the cost of transportation, accommodations, some group meals, and most site entry fees. **This is not a bill.**

Fees are billed from Syracuse University following the online registration period and will appear on a subsequent Bursar statement. Students receive an email notice to view their bill in MySlice. **These fees are not included** in either the tuition or program fee charges, which are typically billed prior to course fee billing. Any fee increases or new course-related fees approved after this date will be announced prior to registration. All students who register for a course with a course-related fee are required to pay the fee, even if they are only auditing the course.

Financial Deadline to Withdraw from the Program: Please refer to the [SU Tuition, Fees, and Related Policies Bulletin](#) for information on refund of course-related fees for students who withdraw from the program voluntarily, involuntarily, or due to suspension or expulsion.

Financial Drop Deadline: Students who drop a class by the Financial Deadline indicated in MySlice may request a refund of any unspent or uncommitted portion of the course fees. There is no refund of course fees to students who drop a course after this deadline.
