Prepare for Online Registration (scheduled for November 13–20)

STEP 1: Request courses

- ☐ Review this packet and [course descriptions](#) on the Syracuse Abroad website.
- ☐ Select courses and plan your desired schedule, consulting the [Time Schedule of Classes](#). Meeting days and times for some courses are not yet available (noted as TBA on the schedule). As soon as this information is available, our office will update you via email.
 - You need special permission from Syracuse Abroad to take any course other than those found on the Time Schedule. (Exceptions are made for pre-approved [IE University courses](#) and approved [Universidad Autónoma de Madrid Liberal Arts courses](#) for students accepted to those programs.)
- ☐ Follow the online instructions to complete the Student Advising Form (SAF):
 - Log into your [OrangeAbroad](#) account. Go to **Learning Content > Academic Packet**.
- ☐ Submit your SAF by **October 19**. Be sure to hit “**Submit**.” (Don’t simply print your SAF!)
 - **Do NOT submit more than one questionnaire.**

STEP 2: See your advisor and upload your signed SAF to OrangeAbroad

- ☐ Print the PDF of your submitted SAF (emailed to you after submission), and take it to your advisor(s) for signature(s) and to ensure your course plan will keep you on track for graduation.
 - It is helpful to print and provide your advisor with [descriptions](#) of all the courses you want to have approved.
- ☐ Upload SAF signed by your advisor(s) to OrangeAbroad by **October 31**.
 - Upload to Questionnaires: Student Advising Form (with Advisor’s Signature). Be sure to hit “Submit” (NOT “Save!”). **Only legible PDF files will be accepted.**
 - Syracuse Abroad will record any changes made on your uploaded SAF as a result of your meeting with your advisor(s). Please indicate whether you have made any changes to your original selections.

STEP 3: REGISTER ONLINE for your classes **November 13-20**.

- ☐ Please note that appointment start times vary.
- ☐ It can be helpful to refer to your SAF when you register. You may return to OrangeAbroad to access your uploaded form at any time.

Grades and Academic Resources

- At Syracuse University, all work for registered classes must be completed on or before the degree certification date. If you are graduating, seek advice from your home college regarding your degree certification date, and also be certain that you are aware of any remaining degree requirements.

Madrid Center Course Information

All Madrid Center courses expected to be offered this semester are listed on the provisional [Time Schedule of Classes](#) and [Timetable schematic](#). Syracuse University reserves the right to cancel a course with low enrollment or to change the course format to an independent study.

- Where there is greater demand than space available in a course, preference for enrollment is given to majors and minors or others who can demonstrate academic need (i.e., the course fulfills a specific requirement that cannot be met by another course) and who have listed the course among their Primary Course Selections on the SAF.
- Be sure you have met all prerequisites for courses you plan to take. Prerequisites are indicated in [course descriptions](#), with equivalent courses described for visiting students. If you do not meet the prerequisite, do not include the course on your SAF.

New Courses for Spring 2019

- **BIO 300.1** - [Drug Discovery](#). Drug discovery is the process by which potential new medicines are identified. In this course, we will explore historical perspectives of traditional drug discovery, and the use of new biotechnology tools that can be applied for the discovery and design of new drugs.
- **PSY 315** - [Drugs and Human Behavior](#). This course provides an overview of the effects of psychoactive drugs on human behavior. Course content includes basic pharmacology, neurobiology (how drugs affect the nervous system), historical contexts of drug use, as well as the short- and long-term effects of various psychoactive drugs. This course will also cover the treatment and prevention of substance use disorders.

Pending Class Times

Class times have yet to be scheduled for Drug Discovery (BIO 300.1), Economics of European Integration (ECN 361), Understanding 20th Century Spain (HST 412/PSC 422), and Drugs and Human Behavior (PSY 315). You will be notified as soon as the information is available.

Program Requirements

All students are required to take the following:

- A **Signature Seminar** ([Azahar](#), [Imperium](#), [Spanish Identities](#), or [Marine Ecology of the Mediterranean Sea and North Africa](#); 3 credits). You may not drop the Signature Seminar.
- A **minimum of 12 credits** in addition to Signature Seminar credits. Due to the Spanish immigration requirements that undergraduate students enroll on a full-time basis, you may not drop below 12 credits (excluding any Signature Seminar credits) at any point during the semester.
- **At least one course taught in Spanish. Students at an advanced level must take TWO courses.** You can find out your specific requirement(s) by identifying your language level and consulting the following chart. Please also refer to the [course descriptions](#) on our website.

Spanish Language Placement Exam

Visiting students: If you are unsure of your language level, review the Spanish language [course descriptions](#) and consult with an advisor in the languages department of your home school. You may also request access to SU's online placement exam by [emailing Jeanne Chu](#).

MATRICULATED SYRACUSE STUDENTS: You must take the online Spanish language placement survey/exam (accessed through [MySlice](#)) **BEFORE** submitting your SAF **UNLESS** one of the below applies:

- You have already taken one or more SPA classes [at Syracuse](#). **OR**
- You have previously taken SU's Spanish online placement exam.

All other SU students—including beginners, native and heritage speakers of Spanish, AND students with AP, IB, or other college-level or transfer Spanish credit—**must** take the placement survey/exam. This will identify your language level and allow you to register in MySlice for the appropriate course. [Instructions on accessing this exam](#) are available online.

SU Spanish beginners: YES! Even if you have no experience studying the language, you must complete the exam in order to receive your SPA 101 placement. *If you don't take the exam, MySlice will prevent you from registering online for your Spanish class. No exceptions.*

ALL STUDENTS, please note! The exam was written for first-year college students. When you are asked how many years you have studied Spanish in high school, respond with your **TOTAL NUMBER of years** of Spanish study, **whether in high school or college.**

Study Tours and Course Fees

Some courses include required study tours, site visits, or activities that are an integral part of the course. Please carefully review the [Course-related Fee Sheet](#), and also share it with your parents/guardians if they are responsible for your fees. Fees to cover the costs of supplies and mandatory field study are charged automatically to your Bursar account when you register.

If you register for any course with a mandatory study tour, you must participate in this field study. **DO NOT PLAN PERSONAL TRAVEL until you get to Madrid and know when you may be required to take part in a class-related study tour, make-up classes, Signature Seminar sessions, exam periods, and other academic commitments.**

Online Registration Dates and Details

You will register online **November 13-20**. In **early November**, before online registration starts, you will receive information about registering for your Madrid Center courses. Be sure to regularly check your email for this information. The Registration Packet will include instructions, FAQs, and your individual registration appointment time.

During online registration, you must register for 12-16 credits (up to 5 semester courses), not counting Signature Seminar credits. Students participating in a [Special Program](#) must register online for their Syracuse Madrid Center courses through SU's [MySlice](#) system; *you will register for your local university courses separately.*

Remember that some courses are likely to reach capacity and close during registration. Be sure to select some alternative classes on your Student Advising Form, in case a class you would like to take is closed when you register.

→ Any registration restrictions will be announced in the Registration Packet available prior to online registration.



Special Programs

Syracuse Abroad's special programs in Madrid make local partner university courses available to students in addition to their Center classes. **The courses offered by these local institutions are open only to students accepted to the respective programs.** These programs differ from the Madrid Center program in several significant ways:

- Because local universities follow different academic calendars, students participating in these programs are required to stay beyond the regular SU Madrid Center program end-date.
- All students will participate in Syracuse Abroad online registration between November 13 and 20 to register for your Madrid Center courses. However, Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (UAM) and IE University (IEU) also have their own online application and registration processes for their courses.

After you have been accepted to a special program, [Rick Cieri](#), your Admissions Counselor, will work directly with you to guide you through the admissions and registration processes specific to the local institution. *Please see the following information for [UAM](#)- or [IEU](#)-specific details.*

- Your SAF should include both your preferred Madrid Center courses **AND** local university courses so that your advisor(s) can approve all your Primary and Alternative Selections. **Please submit, have signed, and upload the SAF with approvals for at least four (4) Center courses of interest and four (4) preferred UAM or IEU courses (Primary and Alternate Selections, in descending order of preference).**
- Planning a schedule that includes one or two local courses, the required Spanish language course, and other Center courses may be challenging or not possible. This will depend on your language level, what Center courses you need or want, and the final local university class schedule. If you participate in a special program, our Madrid Center staff will work with you once abroad to plan a schedule that balances these considerations.
- Grades for courses taken at UAM and IEU may not post to your SU transcript until **August**. At Syracuse University, you must complete all work for registered classes on or before the degree certification date. If you are graduating, seek advice from your home college regarding your degree certification date.
- **We cannot guarantee specific course offerings, especially at our partner institutions.** Therefore, you should not count on taking—or fulfilling specific degree requirements with—a particular UAM or IEU course. Instead, select four (4) primary and alternative local university courses and have them approved by your home college.

Madrid Center & Liberal Arts at UAM Program

The end date for the [Madrid Center & Liberal Arts in Spanish at UAM](#) special program is **June 1**.

As you pre-select your courses, please be aware that the commute by train from the Syracuse Madrid Center to the UAM takes about 30-45 minutes (the train stop is located on the UAM campus). **This means that you cannot take a course at the Madrid Center that meets immediately before or after a UAM course.**

On your SAF, please include the same four (4) courses that you selected in your UAM Learning Agreement.

UAM program students must upload passports to OrangeAbroad by **October 18**. The UAM application and online registration processes must be completed no later than **October 24**. In November, you will receive information directly from UAM regarding pre-enrollment for UAM courses.

Course-related Fees Madrid - Spring 2019

Review and give to your parent/guardian.

Students who register for any of the courses listed below will be charged a fee to cover special activities, such as study tours or site visits, which are an integral part of each course. Study tour fees may reflect the cost of transportation, accommodations, some group meals, and most site entry fees. **This is not a bill.**

Fees are billed from Syracuse University following the online registration period and will appear on a subsequent Bursar statement. Students receive an email notice to view their bill in MySlice. **These fees are not included** in either the tuition or program fee charges, which are typically billed prior to course fee billing. Any fee increases or new course-related fees approved after this date will be announced prior to registration. All students who register for a course with a course-related fee are required to pay the fee, even if they are only auditing the course.

Financial Deadline to Withdraw from the Program: Please refer to the [SU Tuition, Fees, and Related Policies Bulletin](#) for information on refund of course-related fees for students who withdraw from the program voluntarily, involuntarily, or due to suspension or expulsion.

Financial Drop Deadline: Students who drop a class by the Financial Deadline indicated in MySlice may request a refund of any unspent or uncommitted portion of the course fees. There is no refund of course fees to students who drop a course after this deadline.
