Revolutions, War, and the Prospects for Democracy in the Middle East

Dubai, UAE

June 2-16, 2019

PSC/IRP/MES 400/600 (3 or 6 credits;

Taught by Professor Mehrzad Boroujerdi From a foreign policy perspective, the program will examine the influence of global

players and stakeholders in the region, including Turkey, Iran, and especially the role of the United States.

Religion, Law, and Human Rights in a Comparative Perspective

Strasbourg, France

May 16 - June 22, 2019

IRP/MES/PSC 400.1/600.1 (3 credits; undergraduate or graduate)

Taught by Professor Yuksel Sezgin

Focusing on both European and non-European jurisdictions, this course will introduce you to contemporary debates about the role of religion in public and political life, and familiarize you with critical human and women's rights issues. You will also discuss contemporary multicultural and pluri-legal challenges to universal human rights values and principles.

Women and Gender in the Arab World

Beirut, Lebanon

June 14-June 23, 2019

ENG 360/730, WGS/MES/QSX 400/600

Travel to Beirut for ten days to directly engage with issues pertaining to the study of gender and sexuality in the Arab world. Covering a variety of historical, national, socio-cultural, literary, and theoretical perspectives, this course provides students with tools to comprehend the issues, debates, and discussions shaping constructions of gender and sexuality in Arab societies.

French for Diplomacy

Strasbourg, France

May 16 - June 22, 2019

FRE 300 (3 credits; undergraduate) Pre-requisite: FRE 202

Students will combine French language instruction in the classroom and participation in numerous site visits in Strasbourg during this five-week summer course. This course can be combined with Religion, Law, and Human Rights in Strasbourg.

Survey of Current Issues in African Migration

Accra, Ghana

June 1 - July 27, 2019

IRP/ANT 400/600/PAI 600 (3 credits; undergraduate or graduate) This fieldwork practicum provides unique access to the International Organization for Migration's technical cooperation and capacity-building projects in Ghana and exposes students to the complexities of implementing humanitarian and development programs. You may work in Accra or rural areas alongside professionals in the field.

Middle East Policy and Security Studies

Herzliya, Israel

May 12-27, 2019

PSC 400 (3 credits; undergraduate)

This two-week program features some of the top security and terrorism experts from inside and outside Israel. Learn first-hand how Israelis approach conflict and grapple with terrorism and other security issues. Class lectures will feature a wide range of topics from media and the Middle East to dilemmas in counter-terrorism decision making and the Persian Gulf.
