

	\rightarrow	Upload PDF to Questionnaire : Student Advising Form (<i>with Advisor's Signature</i>). If the SAF is not signed by your advisor, also upload any documentation of the conversation with your advisor. Be sure to hit 'Submit' (not 'Save').
	\rightarrow	Syracuse Abroad will record any changes made on your uploaded SAF as a result of consultation with your advisor(s).

STEP 4 - Register for classes on site in Strasbourg.

→ It can be helpful to refer to your SAF when you register. You may access your uploaded SAF by returning to the Questionnaire at any time.

GRADES AND ACADEMIC RESOURCES

- ➤ IMPORTANT: You must remain in good academic standing to participate in our program. If you are placed on academic probation prior to departure, you will be withdrawn from the program. You should carefully review other academic policies applicable to all Syracuse Abroad programs.
- At Syracuse University, all work for registered classes must be completed on or before the degree certification date. If you are graduating, you should seek advice from your home college regarding your degree certification date and also be certain you are aware of any remaining degree requirements.
- ➤ Information on enrollment policies, grades, SU library resources, registration, internships and independent research can be found on the <u>Preparing To Gowebsite</u>. Visiting students should also look at this site for information on transfer credit and <u>requesting an SU transcript</u>.
- If you intend to take an SU main campus or University College online course during a semester abroad, first review Syracuse Abroad-specific <u>requirements and advice</u>.
- Arrangements to do coursework on an <u>independent research basis</u> if needed to satisfy a degree requirement must be made in advance. Due date for such proposals is April 15.
- You should regularly check your *syr.edu* email for messages from Syracuse Abroad.

COURSE INFORMATION

All courses expected to be offered this semester are listed on the provisional Schedule of Classes. Syracuse University reserves the right to cancel a course with low enrollment or to change the course format to an independent study.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduates are required to register for the following:

- At least 12 credits. You may not register for more than 19 total credits without approval from your home college (visiting students seek approval from Syracuse Abroad); registration over 19 credits is subject to additional per-credit tuition charges.
- At least one course taught in French. If you are at the beginning or intermediate levels, this course will be FRE 101, 102, 201 or 202. If you have completed four semesters of college-level French, or its equivalent, you will take FRE 325 and/or another course taught in French (FRE 307 or FRE/HST 447).
 - > Students admitted to partner university programs at the Université de Strasbourg fulfill this requirement by taking French language instruction OR content courses taught in French (EX: political science, history, math, French literature, etc.) at the local university.

>	Matriculated Syracuse students : Unless one of the below applies, you <i>must</i> take the online French placement survey/exam (accessed through MySlice) before submitting your SAF:

	All other SU students, including native and heritage speakers of French and students with FRE AP, IB, or other college-level or transfer credit, should take the placement survey/exam before submitting their SAF. COURSE CHANGES

The courses below have been re-numbered and/or re-titled. While the descriptions and syllabi have been updated, course content is essentially the same.

INTERNSHIP SCHEDULING

If you have applied for and are successfully placed in an internship in Strasbourg, please be aware of the following time commitments:

- For IPA 470, 1-credit placements, students generally spend one half-day per week at their placement.
- For PSC 471, 3-credit Council of Europe internships, students generally spend two half-days at the Council each week; time commitments may vary depending on the nature of the assignment.

STUDY TOURS/COURSE FEES

Some courses include required study tours that are an integral part of the course. Please carefully review the course-related fee sheet and also share it with your parents/guardians if they are financially responsible for your fees. If you register for any course with a mandatory study tour(s), you must participate in this field study. Fees to cover the costs of these study tours are charged automatically to your Bursar account once your registration is processed in late September. Do not plan personal travel until you get to Strasbourg and know when you may be required to take part in a class-related study tour, make-up classes, exam periods, and other academic commitments.



COURSE-RELATED FEES STRASBOURG FALL 2021

REVIEW AND GIVE TO YOUR PARENT/GUARDIAN

Students who register for any of the courses listed below will be charged a fee to cover special activities, such as study tours, which are an integral part of the course. Study tour fees may reflect the cost of transportation, accommodations, some group meals, and most site entry fees. This is not a bill.

Fees are billed from Syracuse University following the overseas registration period, appearing on a subsequent Bursar statement. Students receive an email notice to view their bill in MySlice. These fees are not included in either the tuition or program fee charges, which are billed prior to departure. Any new course-related fees or fee increases approved after this date will be announced prior to registration. All students who register for a course with a course-related fee are required to pay the fee, even if they are only auditing the course.

Financial Deadline to Withdraw from the Program: Please refer to the SU Tuition, Fees, and Related Policies Bulletin for information on refund of course-related fees for students who withdraw from the program voluntarily, involuntarily, or due to suspension or expulsion.

Drop Deadline: Students who drop a class by the Drop Deadline indicated in MySlice may request a refund of any unspent or uncommitted portion of the course fees. There is no refund of course fees to students in the program who make course/credit changes after this deadline.

PARTNER UNIVERITY PROGRAMS

IMPORTANT: Grades for courses in the partner university programs may not be posted to your SU transcript until March so you should ensure that this timing will not adversely affect you academically or in terms of financial aid awarding. At Syracuse University, all work for registered classes must be completed on or before the degree certification date. If you are graduating, you should seek advice from your home college regarding your degree certification date and also be certain you are aware of any remaining degree requirements.

French Language Institute, Université de Strasbourg (Unistra) and Sciences Po Strasbourg

If you have been admitted to one of the French partner university programs, you need to complete and upload your Student Advising Form seeking approval for any courses offered at the Strasbourg Center in which you are interested. Recommended center courses include <u>FRE 307</u> and <u>FRE/HST 447</u>, which are taught exclusively in French.

You will <u>not</u> be able to indicate specific IIEF/Unistra/Sciences Po courses on your SAF; see below tips for your specific program on what to find and select in each dropdown.

Registration for all partner university programs is completed in Strasbourg once students have had an opportunity to attend classes.

For students enrolled in the French Language Institute (Institut International d'Etudes Françaises):

You will take the French placement exam at the IIEF upon arrival in Strasbourg and will be placed into the required French-language core class (6 credits) based on your level. You may also choose to register for a variety of elective one-credit courses at the IIEF in subjects including history, literature, cinema, political science, etc., <u>OR</u> combine classes at the Syracuse Strasbourg Center with IIEF courses, schedule permitting. IIEF courses may be grouped together to fulfill course and/or credit requirements.

When completing your SAF:

- o be sure to select 'IIEF French Language Instruction [6cr]' under French (program requirement)
- you may indicate your intention to take one or more 1-credit courses by selecting 'IIEF Course(s)
 TBD [generally 1 cr]' under Course Selection (this may mean selecting this dropdown option more
 than once).

For students enrolled at the Université de Strasbourg and Sciences Po Strasbourg:

Syracuse Strasbourg Center Assistant Director, Dr. Mary Boyington, will be (or has been) in direct contact with you for advising and pre-enrollment/registration. Because Fall 2021 course schedules are not available until shortly before the semester starts, initial course selection for the Université de Strasbourg main campus (UdS) and Sciences Po-Strasbourg is based on course offerings from the previous academic year. We suggest that you pre-select several courses with your academic advisor in case of any scheduling conflicts/changes.

Read the below tips for completing your SAF depending on your specific program.

- Sciences Po-Strasbourg Students may take courses for 1st, 2nd, and 4th-year students as well as courses
 designed for visiting international students.
 - When completing your SAF, select the generic 'Sciences Po-Strasbourg course(s) TBD [generally 2-3 cr]' as placeholder(s) for the number of credits you intend to take at the local university (this may mean selecting this dropdown option more than once).
- Main University campus (UdS) Students may take courses for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd-year students in the
 departments of Letters (French and comparative literature), foreign languages, social sciences, philosophy,
 history, arts and theater, etc.
 - When completing your SAF, select the generic 'U of Strasbourg course(s) TBD [generally 2-3 cr]' as placeholder(s) for the number of credits you intend to take at the local university (this may mean selecting this dropdown option more than once).

Depending on your specific major, you will also take 2-3 of the following:

PHY 280.1 - General Physics II and

PHY 280.2 - General Physics Laboratory II

If you have room in your schedule for three additional credits, you may also consider an optional academic elective from among offerings at the Strasbourg Center.*
