There are tons of food markets as well, they are all delicious and have tons of options!



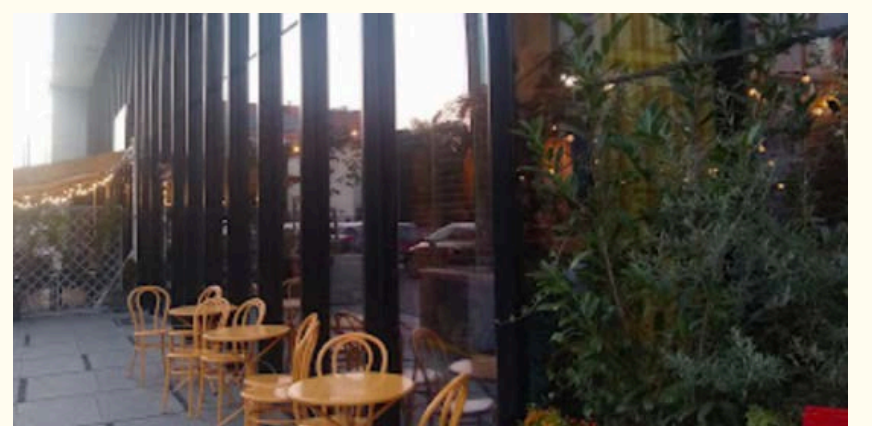

Tips, Tricks, and Wroclaw

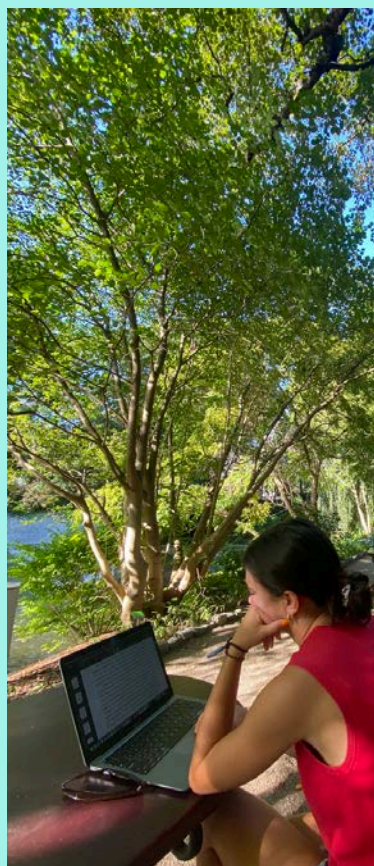
There are tons of sites in Wroclaw with views of the city. I recommend visiting as many as possible! My favorite was the Church with a Bridge
