Study at Partner University: Additional Tuition will never be directly billed to students. Program fee varies subject to student's registration & housing requirements.

The academic calendars at partner universities may differ from the SU Center academic calendar and may require additional housing days based on the student's registration.

Program Fee

- General orientation, cultural activities
- Syracuse Abroad Insurance, including emergency travel insurance
- Membership with International SOS Assistance, a medical and security advisory service
- Pre-departure materials and advising
- Fortifies the broad support we have in place for our students
- Includes services not covered by tuition and for which a separate fee is not charged
- Students placed with host families receive 12 meals weekly
- A unlimited semester tram and bus pass
- All-School trips to Paris, Munich and the Austrian Alps or Provence (France); or similar locations. Travel includes some or all: transportation, meals, activities, and museum and event costs
- One or two day trips
- Extensive support system to respond to student needs

La Canopée Apartment

- Single bed
- Wardrobe

- Private bathroom
- Bed linens, a pillow, a duvet, a bath mat, and towels

La Canopée Apartment Refundable Security Deposit

- La Canopée Apartment students will be charged a \$300 refundable deposit at the time of billing.
 - The deposit will be credited back to the student's bursar account following a final walk-through, provided no damages, cleaning services were rendered or lost/unreturned/damaged keys are reported.
 - If damages are identified, cleaning services were rendered and/or lost/unreturned/damaged keys are reported during the walk-through, the refund amount will be adjusted accordingly, providing they are less than the deposit amount.
 - If the cost of damages, cleaning services rendered and/or replacement keys exceeds the deposit, the student will be charged the additional amount on their bursar account.

Estimated Personal Expenses section above contains estimates and will vary according to individual spending habits. These are typical amounts students can expect to spend out-of-pocket while studying abroad.

Meals (meals not covered by program fee)

- Includes meals not provided through housing arrangements.

Required Personal Expenses and Travel

- Includes personal items, transportation, and other incidental expenses during mandatory travel.
- Students can spend less by choosing budget friendly options.

Personal Travel Expenses (Optional)

- Includes lodging, transportation and other incidentals during the break period, as well as weekend travel.
- Students can spend less by choosing budget friendly options.

Charges for tuition, program fee and course fees are fixed and billed through the Syracuse University bursar system. Other expenses are estimated based on current information and are subject to change due to inflation and fluctuating exchange rates.
